Thank you for sharing information regarding the International Arab Baccalaureate (IAB) with the University of Cambridge. The relevant committee has considered this and agreed the following:

International Arab Baccalaureate (IAB) students will only be considered as competitive for Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences courses (including Economics) and Psychological and Behavioural Sciences. It is very important that you are studying subject relevant modules in your IAB. If you require further advice and guidance, you should contact the College that you wish to apply to directly.

The IAB is not considered suitable preparation for a competitive application to Cambridge science courses (excluding Psychological and Behavioural Sciences). You will also need to undertake further study. Examples of suitable further study include relevant science Olympiads, SAT Subject Tests, A Levels, the International Baccalaureate (IB), Advanced Placement (AP) Tests, or possibly the first year of an undergraduate degree at a university outside the UK.

The University of Cambridge is a Collegiate University and applicants are encouraged to contact the College they wish to apply to for further information regarding entry requirements, especially for science courses where additional qualifications or assessment will be required.
